UNEXPECTED OUTCOME:

At the start of the professional development programme on ICT for ATL, VVOB established an ICT core group in all TTIs. The only selection criteria were to have teacher trainers who were ICT enthusiasts (and not technical experts per se), who were willing to share their experiences and who were representing different subject departments of the TTI. In Nghe An TTI all the (number) members of the ICT core group are female. This makes that for the multiplication workshops it is now a group of experienced, only female experts, who introduce their peers and colleagues in the use of ICT for Active Teaching and Learning.

A DAY AT THE RIVER BANK OF QUANG NGAI

Very early in the morning of Wednesday 31 March a group of 20 excited students gathered in a classroom of Phạm Văn Đồng Teacher Training University in Quang Ngai City.

Teachers provided some introduction to the activity that was bound to happen that day: a try-out of a module for outdoor activities related to Biology and Chemistry with the title "Investigation of pollution issues at Tra Khuc River - the stretch from the Sugar Factory to Tra Khuc Bridge 2". The location for this try-out activity was set at the bank of the Tra Khuc river, which is the home of the 'Ca Bong'. These tiny little fish are one of the main food specialties of the province.

The module has been designed applying the Problem Based Learning approach. WOB is supporting Teacher Training Institutes (TTIs) in applying Problem Based Learning (PBL) for the organization of outdoor activities. In short, Problem Based Learning means that students learn from the results of the process of solving problems. This approach is particularly useful for the organization of outdoor activities, although it is not limited to those.

After the short introduction delivered by their teachers, the students - who themselves will be a teacher one day - mounted the bus to arrive 10 minutes later at the river bank. While the rising sun was clearly promising a hot day, the students started their assignments in different groups. One of the assignments was to collect water samples from the river and to test the water quality by using some chemicals and specific devices. The groups had to decide themselves how to organize the tests.

After collecting the samples, conducting tests and interviewing a number of residents living along the river bank, the students looked for some shadow in a nearby park to prepare the presentation of the results. Finally some volunteers of each group presented the results of their activities.

One of the students entrusted the VVOB staff attending the try-out that this is for sure the kind of activity she wants to organize for her students later on.







Activities of the past quarter

DOETs

In February a **study tour was organized for school principals.** It was the conclusion to the Singapore training **(7 topics for school principals)** which was delivered in collaboration with NIEM. During this study tour, the participants attended a workshop on "ATL for school principals" and visited some pilots schools in Nghe An or Quang Ninh province.

In March the DOET core groups were trained (ToT) to deliver an "ICT for ATL" training. In April, after having been certified, the 5 DOET core groups started multiplying the ICT for ATL training in each district.

Still in April, NIEM's lecturers, in collaboration with VVOB and an external consultant, **revised** and improved the "ATL for school principals" training. The feedback collected during the Study Tour (see above) were incorporated in this revised version.

Finally in May the DOETs core groups were trained to deliver an "ATL for school principals" training in their respective provinces. This training was organized in collaboration with NIEM.



TEACHER TRAINING INSTITUTES

At the start of 2010, ICT core group members were introduced in **facilitation techniques** to prepare for the multiplication workshops on integration of ICT in teaching and learning. A group of about 70 trained experts from the ICT core group started **multiplying trainings and workshops on ICT for ATL.**

During a **workshop on e-learning**, ICT core group members and ICT enthusiasts came to a common understanding of the concept of e-learning in the higher education context in Vietnam. During the **workshop on ICT for sharing and collaboration**, the same ICT core group got an introduction in web 2.0 tools and put their heads together to set up online platforms to share their experiences of integrating ICT and to collaborate on projects.

28 teacher trainers from the ICT core group and methodology core group were consulted in the **revision process of the ICT for ATL toolkit**. The toolkit will be further developed in collaboration with the ADB project from the MOET targeting the most disadvantaged regions in Vietnam.

The new members of the research group doing research on integration of ICT attended the **Global Learn Asia-Pacific 2010 conference**, Two papers by VVOB Vietnam were presented during the conference.

Between January and March, each institute organized **a try-out of the modules** that were developed during the sharing workshop together with students.

In January, 11 Mini-project owners gathered in Hanoi and received expert feedback on the implementation of their projects and a short training in Results Based Management.

In March, the **newly established methodology core groups** were consulted on the outline of the **teacher training manual on Problem-Based Learning** by Dr. Le Huy Hoang from the Hanoi National University of Education.

In March, it was agreed to broaden the developed ICT instructional technology plans to cover **the process of education innovation** in the TTIs in general. Aspects of teaching methodology and pedagogic change initiatives now have a more central place in the planning documents. The research group is extended with 10 extra teacher trainers who are currently setting up research on education innovation processes taking place in their respective TTIs. A **research skills workshop** took place in Hanoi in April to give some orientation to the research group. An online platform (https://sites.google.com/site/rgvvob/) should encourage the members to share and collaborate.





MASS ORGANIZATIONS

In January, Provincial Core Group members were introduced to Facilitation & Communication skills to prepare for the multiplication workshops on mobilization of family and community participation for education support.

In March, a workshop on **Life Skills for Youth** was organized to introduce concepts, roles of stakeholders and benefits to provincial core groups so that provinces are ready for the **multiplication workshops on integration of parent support for education of children.**

The **booklet "Mobilization of families' and community's participation in children's active learning"** has been finalized in terms of content and design. The launch of the publication will follow soon...

June saw the provincial **Mid-term review** of the pilot model **"Educational clubs"** with participation of mass organizations and representatives, school principles and club members.

Educational Corner Corn

As one of the capacity building activities of the Social Participation (SP) component, a Training of Trainers (ToT) course on "Life Skills for youth" was organized in March 2010 for SP provincial core members. The course not only provided participants with knowledge on Life Skills including Communication and Interpersonal Skills, Decision-Making and Critical Thinking Skills, Coping and Self-Management Skills, but also gave them the chance to practice these skills through a variety of fun educational games.

Within this newsletter, we would like to share with you one of the educational games that made us thrilled. The game which is called Active Listening is simple and easy to play. This is how it works::

Name: Active Listening Duration: 20 minutes

How to play: Participants are divided into two groups and sit down along 2 parallel lines, in pairs. The members of Group 1 describe a picture which is shown only to them. The members of Group 2 try to draw this based on the description of the other group. During the 1st round, the pairs sit facing each other's while during the 2nd play through they will sit back to back.

Questions for reflection after the game:

- Which round is more difficult and why?
- Which round has more correct drawings and why?
- What do you think the meaning of the game is:

Conclusion:

In order to achieve desirable outcomes, message transmission as well as receiving must be precise. Besides verbal language, sign/body language is also important.

FOOD FOR THOUGHT

In this issue we will introduce two terms between which people are often confused: sex and gender

Gender is used to describe those characteristics of women and men, which are socially constructed. People are born female or male but learn to be girls and boys who grow into women and men. STAKEHOLDER IN THE PICTURE

VVOB is pleased to introduce you to Mr. Nguyen Van Loc – the coordinator of the Education Management Component at Quang Nam DOET.

Quang Nam DOET has proven to be an active and reliable partner in the cooperation with VVOB. The enthusiasm, professional attitude and hard work of Mr. Nguyen Van Loc can not be overstated in that respect. Whoever meets him for the first time will be impressed by his gentle smile and outgoing personality.

Duirng a recent training of VVOB in Hanoi, we took the opportunity to talk to him about workshops on ICT for ATL that VVOB recently deployed to the provinces.

1. Please tell us something about yourself and your work with VVOB?

My name is Nguyen Van Loc, Deputy Head of the Department of Secondary Education – Quang Nam DOET, in charge specifically of lower secondary education. I have been working with WOB since 2009 in the capacity of provincial coordinator of the education management component.

2. We understand that you combine the function of provincial coordinator with the one of core trainer. What are the advantages and disadvantages of doing so?

It is convenient for me to be in charge of the planning and the training content, to directly take part in the selection of our core groups, to supervise the training quality and to take the lead in the multiplication process at provincial level. The only difficulty is to arrange the time because I am quite busy with my other professional work in the Department.

3.Can you tell us something more about the Trainer-of-Trainers training on ICT for ATL?

This training is necessary and practical. The content is very useful and the methodology is very effective. It also contributes to sustainability at the local level because VVOB has helped us to train the trainers on ICT for ATL. The training is followed by a pilot and afterwards by multiplication in the province towards lower secondary teachers. Those teachers in turn will share their experience with other colleagues. The effects of such activities will spread like when we throw a stone into the water.

4. Can you share with us the results of pilot and multiplication classes in the province?

So far, our province has completed 18 classes with a total of 540 students. After the training, most students were able to use the software actively while teaching specific lessons. As target group, we selected principals, vice-principals and heads of subjects with the aim that those core groups will deliver the training to their colleagues at school. We also want to build an Open Resource Centre. For that reason we requested each participating school for a lesson plan on the application of one learning software.

5. How do you assess the partnership with VVOB?

We are very grateful for all VVOB's support. This is a great and efficient collaboration. I am happy that VVOB always appreciates our contribution in the design and implementation of programme activities. VVOB is also very supportive to our initiatives. For example, after the training for principals under the Vietnam-Singapore programme, VVOB has supported our initiative of expanding the training to our educational managers in DOET and BOETs.

After the pilot and multiplication of ICT for ATL, we would like to hold a teaching contest using ICT for ATL and we hope to receive continued support from VVOB.

I personally find it very pleasant to work with WOB in general and the EM component in particular. Please send my sincere thanks to them.

6. Do you have anything else to share?

I want to reiterate that the support from VVOB to us is extremely practical and valuable. Let's hope for good results in 2010 and good prospects for cooperation for the second phase of the programme from 2011 to 2013. Good luck to the cooperation between Quang Nam DOET and VVOB!
